ACADEMIC TRAVEL


Franklin University offers an educational experience beyond just the classroom in Lugano. Academic TravelTM is an integral part of Franklin's educational curriculum.

INDEPENDENT TRAVEL

Lugano's very central location within Europe means it is very easy to explore the continent on weekends. Within an hour from major alpine ski slopes and the city of Milan (by train or car), and about two hours away from Zurich or the Mediterranean Sea, Franklin students can have very interesting travel experiences during their studies. Airports in Lugano and Milan allow students to also fly to major European cities such as Paris, Madrid, Berlin, Rome, Amsterdam, London, Stockholm, and Prague.

ADMISSIONS

Franklin University Switzerland follows typical U.S. admissions procedures.

Undergraduate Admissions

Students should submit:

- 1. A completed application form and fee
- 2. An essay and personal statement
- 3. An official copy of the secondary school transcript showing courses and grades
- 4. A mid-semester or mid-year school report from the school counselor
- 5. Two letters of recommendation
- 6. Submitting SAT or ACT scores is required for US students. Franklin's codes are 0922 (SAT) and 5223 (ACT)
- 7. For students whose first language is not English, English proficiency test results (e.g. TOEFL or IELTS scores) are required.
