



Pursue Doctor of Medicine Program Through Accelerated Pathway

Franklin University Switzerland (FUS) in Sorengo, Switzerland, together with St. George's University (SGU) School of Medicine in Grenada, the Caribbean, offers a unique opportunity to obtain a Bachelor of Science and Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree. The pathway starts at FUS, where you will spend three years completing the Pre-Health Sciences curriculum. You will then have the option to begin the 4-Year MD Program in Grenada or the UK. You will earn your bachelor's degree after successfully completing the first year.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Applications are reviewed holistically by FUS and SGU. General guidance includes:

- Strong high school grades in the sciences and math.
- You must meet all SGU's School of Medicine admissions criteria.
- You can opt into the SGU track from the first year of your studies at FUS by applying to SGU. You will be guaranteed an interview and, if successful, you will be issued a provisional offer.

For students from the US only:

• When you complete the undergraduate program, you must maintain a GPA of 3.4 or above and obtain a **competitive score on the MCAT within 5 points of the average MCAT score (498)** for entering students.

ADVANTAGES

- Enter SGU's 4-Year MD Program directly without competing for a space.
- Start your 4-Year MD Program in Grenada or the UK.
- Complete clinical training at **a network of hospitals in the US and in the UK** during the MD program.
- Earn both an undergraduate and postgraduate degree in seven years.


