The Program

Created in partnership with SDA Bocconi School of Management, this MA in Responsible Arts Management and Cultural Heritage is designed to provide both a practical and theoretical preparation for change-makers, future leaders and the next generation of art professionals. Through a rigorous curriculum and multicultural experience, the program strives towards preparing leaders for today's international arts and heritage environment.

The program is designed as an applied-learning pathway, including live classroom seminars, online course work and a hands-on, dynamic, experiential learning opportunity. In conjunction with the elite International Program in Arts Management (IPAM) at SDA Bocconi, the program offers a series of masterclasses, a travel agenda through three countries with some of the world's richest cultural heritage, open conversations, company visits, hackathons and other valuable experiences to provide cutting-edge practice. Students will gain the knowledge necessary for collaborating with multiple stakeholders to ensure responsible arts management. Main touchpoints are Law for Arts Management, Arts Collecting, Marketing for the Arts, Ethical Arts Management, Digitalization of Arts Communication and Management, while developing entrepreneurial mindset and leveraging opportunities for networking and career development. Experience turning systemic challenges into functional solutions, through practical projects and strategies, applicable to any arts corporation and institution, business and cultural centers. Additionally, students will earn a Certificate of Arts Management from SDA Bocconi School of Management in conjunction with the Franklin Master of Arts degree.

Franklin partners with SDA Bocconi School of Management, in particular combining the Franklin curriculum with that of Bocconi's International Program in Arts Management (IPAM). A unique opportunity to gather perspectives and best practices from a diverse and intellectual background of arts and culture specialists, professionals from China, India and Italy, plus experts from Franklin and Bocconi.

The program is a valuable opportunity to nurture and grow leadership talent and practical experience in artistic innovation and cultural heritage development worldwide. Students will gain new perspectives to deal with new challenges in the creative industry, arts management and visual and performing arts sector. Future careers could range from service institutions dedicated to the arts, to specialized professionals, managerial consultants and cultural entrepreneurs.

Academic travel to India, China and Italy

Throughout the Specialization Learning Portfolio, students will engage in a combination of field visits, guest lectures and presentation, group discussion and projects, traveling for six weeks between Asia and Europe. A unique journey specifically designed around Asian art and cultural environment, peculiarities of the Indian and Chinese arts market, and visits to local museums, galleries and performing arts institutes. At the same time, it leverages Italian excellence in cultural heritage and artistic production with a clear-cut study tour in major cities of Italy, also synonym for culture, fashion, design, taste and the art of living.

Program Structure

The program is divided into a Common Core and the Specialization Learning Portfolio. The participative and collaborative curriculum of the Common Core is designed to provide students with a strong background in leadership, marketing, finance, project management, and other elements of business through the lens of sustainability, ethics and responsible management. The Specialization Learning Portfolio includes selected sessions and classes, experiential learning through travel and project-based work, consisting in five modules:

- Module 1: one-week Consulting Management for the Arts Module, introducing students to the consulting profession, techniques and methods - in Mumbai, India;
- Module 2: ten-day Performing and Visual Arts Management
 Module, analyzing future trends and organizations working in
 the performing arts field in New Delhi, India;
- Module 3: five-day International Arts Production Module, observing different cultural institutions engaged in the protection, enhancement and conservation of heritage - in Beijing, China;
- Module 4: ten-day Heritage Management Module, focusing on the opportunities and reality of art management and administration - in Milan with the IPAM Study Tour, Italy;
- Module 5, Project-based learning, Internship and Final Project.
